

Assignment Guidelines: e-Book

(this guideline is updated on 1/9 Saturday)

General Instructions:

- **Deadline: Jan. 15, 2010**
- **Send an email or use GSpace to upload your file to our class Gmail account**
 - please name them as "section_number_name_type" with underlines between each word.
 - You can produce the document using 2007 and save it as “.docx”
- **Late assignments are penalized 10 points for each day late.**

Specific Requirements:

Compile your assignments and publish your own e-book.

- Format your Document:
 - Set the margins as 1”
 - Select B5 as the paper size for the entire document.
- You need have a book cover that displays all the necessary information (you may use your Book cover assignment for this part)
- You should write a preface as an introduction at the beginning of your e-book.
- You need to use Word’s “Index and Tables” feature to create an automatic table of contents page (製作目錄)
- Your e-book should have **three chapters with three sections.**
 - Chapter 1: Computer Assignments
 - In this chapter, you should include four assignments you have created throughout this semester: your time management plan, resume, and 3D art work. Before you submit them, make sure you have correct revisions.
 - Chapter 2: Compositions

- In your second chapter, you should include three compositions.
- Chapter 3: Journals
 - For this chapter, you need to collect three journals that you wrote for any of your literature or language course, such as Introduction to Literature, Reading, or Bible as Literature.
- You should have an appropriate title for each chapter and each section and use “Page Break” (分隔設定) to separate each section properly.
- Work with Header and Footer:
 - Choose different design for your first page, odd pages, and even pages.
 - Use “English Department, Fu Jen” as the header for the first page (which is the cover page) and insert the Date.
 - In the header, put your name on the odd page and your title on the even one.
 - In the footer, indicate the pagination.
- Insert a copyright page as your final page. Provide necessary information and apply a text watermark (such as “original” or “copyrighted”).
- Please pay attention to the overall visual effect.
