Written Test & Requirement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ TOEFL test with a minimum grade of 80. ✓ Graduate Record Examination (GRE).
Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ A recognized baccalaureate, graduate or professional degree from a regionally accredited U.S. institution or a comparable degree from an international institution. ✓ For applicants with a bachelor's degree only, a minimum grade point average of B (3.0), calculated from all grades and credits after the semester where the applicant reached 60 semester hours or 90 quarter hours.
Program Specialty	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ The Bilingual/ESOL program area provides students with a thorough understanding of second language learning and teaching, bilingualism, and multiculturalism. ✓ The Master of Arts in Education (M.A.E.) is the degree option for students seeking 36 hours of coursework alone. (No Thesis or Graduation Project required)
